- *Changes for 2023-2024*

- o U10 has been increased to ensure we are following minimum wage standards.
- o 18+ has been increased to recognize the difference in youth vs. adult competition.

Travel Fee Rates:

- Travel fees are based on the officials Home Association.
- If an Official travels over one association boundary they receive an additional \$10.00.
 - o BNWRA and NWVRA are considered one boundary
- If an official travels over two more Association boundaries they receive an additional \$15.00.
- Travel fees to Chilliwack Ringette are capped at \$10.00 regardless of the distance travelled.
- Example:
 - o If an official's home association is Surrey white rock and they referee games in Vancouver they will receive \$15.00 in travel.
 - o If an official's home association is Surrey White Rock and they referee games in Delta they will receive \$10.00 travel as DRA borders SWRRA boundaries.
- If an official travels to an game and does two or more games they will only receive travel subsidy for the first game not any additional subsequent games.

Refereeing Games Alone

- If an official referees a game solo they will receive double pay at their game fee rate.
 - o They do not receive double travel pay.

FUN 1 & 2 Games:

- These games are not normally refereed by certified referees. No payment.
- If an official is requested for a game they will receive the U10 rate of pay.

Referee Levels

- When assigning referees to games, ensure that the referee has the appropriate level of certification and training as outlined in the Officiating Level Requirements table on the [Ringette Canada website](#).

On-ice training

- The referee in -training will receive payment for their on-ice training (unless the Association has a different model in place).
- The official who is scheduled to shadow the new referee will receive their regular game fee compensation.
